

- 6. Name at least 4 states in this region and be prepared to tell what you know about them.
- 7. Name some of the great National Parks located in this region.

It is necessary to emphasize the following points during the lecture about the Western region of the USA.

- Extremely large area in terms of size but relatively small in population
- Has amazing natural beauty and is home to the most famous National Parks
- Yellowstone, Grand Canyon, Grand Teton, Joshua Tree, Bryce Canyon are some of the most famous parks
- Home to "Silicon Valley" and the computer revolution
- The Southwestern part New Mexico, Arizona, southern California are heavily influenced by Hispanic and Native American culture
- The region is rich in natural resources including timber and forest products. Minerals and metal ores are mined here.
- The region often suffers from water shortages and drought
- "new"cities have emerged and grown over the last 30-40 years as the population has increased dramatically, e.g. Phoenix, Arizona, Salt Lake City, Utah, Seattle, Washington, Portland, Oregon
- Has a "different outlook" than the rest of the US because of its Pacific coast. Looks more to China, Japan, and South Korea for trade, culture, and tourism rather than Europe.
