Look at the information about these three most famous and perhaps most important, "Founding Fathers" of the United States and the roles they played in the American Revolution:




George Washington

- was Military leader of the American colonists
- the only serious choice because he had real training and military experience from the British Army during the French and Indian War
- recognized quickly that American citizen-soldiers were no match for a well-trained British Army
- devised a plan to "run away" from the British to gain more time for training
- loved and respected by his officers and soldiers
- very smart and skillful strategically on the battlefield
- pushed for help and cooperation with other European powers

Thomas Jefferson

- was the Philosophical leader of the Americans
- heavily influenced by the ideas and principles of the Enlightenment, especially John Locke
- used these ideas to support his argument for independence in the Declaration Of Independence (July 4, 1776)
- was the principle author of the Declaration of Independence, although he worked as part of a team given the duty to write the document
- also helped on the diplomatic front, traveling to France to help persuade the French to support the Americans



Benjamin Franklin

- was the **Diplomatic leader** of the Americans
- was the most famous American of his time and was well-known and respected throughout Europe
- narrowly missed a personal audience with King George III
- traveled throughout Europe hoping to convince continental powers to support the American cause
- was particularly popular and well-liked in France; key player in getting France to enter the war
- was head of the commission charged with writing the Declaration of Independence
